**Please put any tickets under windshield wiper.
I have to display my papers, not hand them to you.**

-- Georgia Statutes § 17-6-11, § 40-5-29

I'm not signing anything that admits guilt.

Thus I am NOT opening my window.

I will comply with clearly stated lawful orders.

FOR USE IN GEORGIA ONLY

Place the other side against window so police can read it.

Do not speak at all. Not one word. Record everything.

Keep your hands where the officer can see them.

Show them your license and other requested documents through the window.

You are required to “display” them. But you don’t have to hand them over.
So don’t open your window.

In Georgia, if you refuse to sign a ticket the police might arrest you. Record the encounter. If they do it wrong (they usually will), your lawyer should be able to get anything serious dismissed. If the officer says that signing is not an admission of guilt, then you should sign.

Police are allowed to stop you at a checkpoint, but you are not required to open your window.

Never fight or physically resist. If the officer clearly states a lawful order, it is safer to comply.
