

**I REMAIN SILENT**

**NO SEARCHES**

**I WANT MY LAWYER**

**RS 32:411(F)(1) requires me to display my papers. You can see them through my closed window. You cannot arrest me for this: 792 So. 2d 24 (2001).**

**Thus I am NOT opening my window.**

**If you make me sign any tickets, you must release me on recognizance after I sign. RS 32:411.1(A)(4)**

**I will comply with clearly stated lawful orders.**

# FOR USE IN LOUISIANA ONLY

**Place the other side against window so police can read it.**

**Do not speak at all. Not one word. Record everything.**

**Keep your hands where the officer can see them.**

Show them your license and other requested documents through the window. This should be sufficient, and even if not they should not arrest you but merely write you another ticket if they think we're wrong.

The law does require you to sign tickets. Louisiana law requires them to release you upon signing, so it's okay to roll down the window to sign. However, if you can digitally sign using the Fair DUI app or some other app without rolling down the window, that's better.

Police are allowed to stop you at a checkpoint, but you are not required to open your window.

Never fight or physically resist. If the officer clearly states an order, it is safer to comply.
