## I REMAIN SILENT NO SEARCHES I WANT MY LAWYER

Please put any tickets under windshield wiper.

I will show my papers, but not hand them over. §171.08

I am not required to sign any tickets. 169.91(3)

Thus I am NOT opening my window.

I will comply with clearly stated lawful orders.

## FOR USE IN MINNESOTA ONLY

Place the other side against window so police can read it.

Do not speak at all. Not one word. Record everything.

Keep your hands where the officer can see them.

Show them your license and other requested documents through the window. You are not required to hand them over so don't open the window. You may be asked to write your name on a piece of paper in the presence of the officer to verify the license. You can do that without opening the window.

We see no law or rule in Minnesota requiring you to sign tickets and the standard form we've seen does not include a space for the driver's signature. If the officer insists, you can digitally sign with an app like SignEasy.

Police are allowed to stop you at a checkpoint, but you are not required to open your window.

Never fight or physically resist.

If the officer clearly states an order, it is safer to comply.
